1. Definitions and Interpretation

We do use cookies on our website. The cookie that will be used to check if the user has seen the pop up is called ppcookie. This is a lifetime cookie which means that once the user has accepted the use of cookies, the pop up will not keep showing each time a user views a page on our website.

7. How Do We Use Your Data? If we do collect any personal data, it will be processed and stored securely, for no longer than is necessary in light of the reason(s) for which it was first collected. These systems enable us to provide the services we need to. We store data with MagManager, which is a provider of a secure online magazine management software. We store data with Kashflow, which is a secure online accounting system. We store data with Mailchimp, which is a provider of a secure online newsletter and mailing system. Data security is very important to us, and to protect your data we have taken suitable measures to safeguard and secure any data we hold about you (even if it is only your email address).
