CityBreaks - a Weekend less Ordinary

When the world opens up for travel again, the temptation to pack up for a short break will be almost unbearable. But where to go that isn't quite such a well-trod tourist trail?

Here's three destinations that you might not have considered in Europe but that are just a short hop from the UK with flights from regional airports enabling you to get the most out of your weekend.

Vilnius in Lithuania has the largest Baroque Old Town in Eastern Europe. It's a jumble of cobbled streets with bars and restaurants and underground bierkellers. Beautiful Baroque gems like the Palace of the Grand Dukes rub shoulders with more troubling reminders of Lithuania's past under the Nazis and subsequently the Soviets. But now there is a sense of freedom that extends even to declaring part of the city, Uzupis, an independent republic with its own constitution! Explore the markets, try the local dishes or splash out on some Scandinavian fine dining. Climb to the top of the Hill of Three Crosses or Gedimina's Castle for great views over the city.

Taking care of your Dog during Coronavirus outbreak

Recent guidelines say that we have to practice social distancing and stay at home during the Coronavirus lockdown.

This poses a lot of difficulties, but if you are a dog owner you may be additionally concerned about looking after your four-legged friend. Some people may have the option of sending their dog to stay with a friend or family member for the duration, in which case this is a wonderful option. However, for those without that option, below are some tips to keep Fido entertained.

Get active

If you have a garden, spend some time outside every day actively engaging with your dog. Ball throwing can help burn off steam - just be careful not to overdo it; the sudden stopping and turning can be harsh on joints, and even younger dogs are at risk of sprain injuries. Setting up an obstacle/agility course can be another fun way to exercise both mind and body... of dog and owner!

Engage your dog's nose

Dogs have a phenomenal sense of smell – you can try hiding treats or toys around the house or garden for them to find. Or hide yourself and play 'hide-and-seek' with your hound.

Keep that brain active!

Mental exercise can be almost as tiring as physical exercise. Isolation could be the perfect time to try and teach your dog a few new tricks. Maybe you will finally be able to



crack that obedience work you never quite had time for? Or you could get creative – perhaps you were inspired by Crufts and could teach your dog a heel work to music routine to wow friends with post isolation.

Ditch the food bowl

Instead of feeding out of a bowl, try to make mealtimes a more physically and mentally active affair. If you have interactive feeding/ puzzle toys, get these out and start using them. If not, why not try to create your own using safe items around the house? Hide kibble under plastic cups that your dog has to turn over, or in empty toilet rolls/cardboard boxes that he has to search through. Even just sprinkled on the floor is a more entertaining than a bowl. Just make sure you are constantly supervising.

Make a 'snuffle box'

Hide a toy or treat in a cardboard box covered with a blanket so Fido has to snuffle his way in to retrieve the item.

local communities, working outdoors, gathering dandelions for homemade wine - but people could work long hours for little pay. If you are interested in investigating the daily life of these workers, you might like to join the Woodlanders project.

Routes to the Past

The Chiltern Hills are criss-crossed by a network of winding, steep-sided lanes bounded by ancient hedgerows and trees. These local routes joined up communities and linked them with their commons. fields and woods. But despite their fundamental

nature, these routeways have often been neglected and face threats from erosion, development and environmental change. This project records the stories of these historic routeways, helping to increase their visibility and save them for future generations.

The Mystery of Grim's Ditch

The impressive ancient earthwork known as Grim's Ditch stretches across the Chilterns between Bradenham and Berkhamsted. But how old is it? And what was it built for? Volunteers can participate in archaeological fieldwork and research, helping to solve these mysteries.

If you would like to join a volunteering group there are lots of ways to get involved: looking into the history of villages or crafts or families; interviewing local people; walking the old routes; writing local stories; or giving talks and tours. Keeping a Healthy Body and Mind During lockdown

We have heard a lot about keeping fit and healthy within the confines of our homes.

The positives are that we have more time with our families and we finally have time to try out some new recipe ideas for their approval.

This is a great opportunity to learn to cook or to adapt your usual recipes. You might be surprised at the money you save by not having meals out, and the health benefits of eating less 'junk food'!

Plan

I. Take everything out of your food cupboards and freezer and take a photo so you are aware of all the foods you already have

2. Plan meals ahead and make an organised shopping list which will help to minimise shopping time

3. Only buy what you need - don't panic buy

4. Aim to buy and prepare foods that offer a balanced diet – protein foods (meat, fish, eggs, nuts, beans), dairy/dairy alternatives (milk, yogurt, cheese), starchy foods (cereals, potatoes, pasta, bread) and fruit/ vegetables/salads – 5-a-day.

5. Make use of long-life milk foods, dried foods, tinned foods and frozen foods

6. Enjoy eating together making special mealtimes for the family

7. Freeze leftovers into portions

Ideas

• Add red, brown or green lentils to your bolognaise and chilli's

- Try some vegetarian bean based dishes
- Add frozen vegetables to leftover rice for a quick meal
- Use chorizo to add flavour to meals
- Add herbs and spices to dishes to add flavour

• Make fish cakes out of tinned fish and mashed potato

• Make comed beef or brown lentil shepherd's pie



• Make homemade soup out of left over vegetables and vegetable cooking water

• Make your own pasta out of flour and water

• Make your own wraps out of flour, yeast and water

12oz self-raising flour (or 8oz self-raising flour mixed with 4oz ground almonds)
2 teaspoons baking powder
9 tablespoons oil (not olive oil)
12 fl oz water
9oz sugar (granulated, castor or icing sugar)
3 teaspoons vanilla essence
Raspberry jam

Method

- I. Heat oven to 170c
- 2. Mix all the ingredients together

3. Place in a lined baking tray (or in 12 muffin sized paper cases) – add blobs of the jam



4. Cook for 40 minutes for cake (15 minutes for muffin sized cakes)

5. When cold cover in icing (made from icing sugar, water and almond essence)

6. Place a tinned/fresh or frozen raspberry on top if you have them and sprinkle with flaked or chopped almonds

7. Relax and enjoy

Working from home with kids – *Coping with the pressure*

As more of us turn to self-isolation, the burden of work and home schooling is becoming a scary reality. We explore some coping strategies to help home workers cope with what might be the most challenging period of life so far.

"Our kids were off school yesterday both with dry coughs, therefore we are in self-isolation for the near future from today. The reality of home schooling whilst trying to keep on working is very daunting indeed", explains Jonathan Ratcliffe of Offices.co.uk

Working from home is tough. Home schooling is very tough. So, if you must combine the two for a long period of time, how are you going to cope? You are going to have to plan well, get organised and work to a strict timetable if you want to get everything done. Equally, you'll need to have a proper split between work, school, fun and rest. "The first thing you need to do is lower your expectations of what you are going to achieve, both with work and schooling. If you try to do too much the experience is going to be highly stressful", Ratcliffe adds.

Here are a few tips on how to survive:

START EARLY AT THE SAME TIME

EACH DAY: Routine is important for good sleep and mental health, for both you and your kids.

GET DRESSED PROPERLY LIKE TEACHER AND STUDENT: Getting showered and dressed is important to divide sleep

and school.

CREATE SPACES FOR DIFFERENT ACTVITIES: You might set up a teaching room





(kitchen), quiet room (spare bedroom) and a play area (living room).

STRUCTURE YOUR DAY LIKE A

SCHOOL DAY: Teaching time, activity time, play time and lunch time – just like their normal school routine.

MAKE A PLAN WITH YOUR KIDS:

At the start of the day, ask them what they want to do (within reason) so they feel involved.

SET ASIDE BREAKS FOR TV, IPAD

AND EXERCISE: Use these times to schedule work emails or calls.

TAKE EXERCISE: Depending on where you live, if you have a garden or not – try and get some fresh air, this also allows you some headspace.

FINISH AT A SET TIME, BEDTIME AT

A SET TIME: By getting a routine drilled in early on, you can try and get the kids to sleep at a sensible time, thereby giving yourself some space to work if needed.

"We are in unchartered territory here and no one knows what life will look like at the end. It's important to realise that time with your kids is a gift, don't try and do too much – hopefully we can all stay relatively positive through this difficult time", concludes Ratcliffe.

There's no escaping the garden this month...

as if you'd want to!

With two bank holidays, this is a great month for tackling jobs in the garden, so here are my suggestions for what you can be doing.

First, mow the lawn, and not too short if this is one of the first cuts this season. You can cut it again in a week or so.

Drain the water from your water butt if it's a little smelly and scrub it using a brush with fairly rigid bristles, then flush it out with water.

Pot on vegetables sown in the last month or so that need planting out towards the end of the month when the frosts should be over.

Get kids to sow pumpkin seeds to make great low-cost Halloween lanterns later in the year. Place each seed in a 7.5cm (3") pot of multi-purpose compost and keep them moist in a tray on a sunny window sill.

If you've a greenhouse or suitable pop-up or rigid frame for growing tomatoes, make sure you get the plants into large pots or the greenhouse borders now. Insert a cane 5cm (2") from the main stems and tie the young plants to it using a loose loop of twine. Tie in the plants further up the canes as they grow.

Empty water features full of brown, scummy water. Scrub the sides and base, clear the pump of debris and fill with fresh water.

Consider potting up some summer bedding if you've space in a greenhouse or porch, but wait until frosts are over before planting out.

Plant any new shrubs, trees or climbers as soon as possible – even though they should be container grown at this time of year, it is easier for them to get properly established if given a bit of time to



produce new roots before it gets warmer. Water well and top the soil with a 5-7.5cm (2-3") mulch to keep moisture in.

Prune shrubs which have just finished flowering, as this encourages the plant to produce new shoots that will bear next year's flowers.

Remove faded flowers from spring flowering bulbs, this helps conserve energy so they perform well next year. Apply a good feed either to the roots or the foliage.

Vigorous climbers like clematis, roses, hops and vines should grow rapidly now, so tie them into their supports regularly with flexible ties.

Clip box shrubs with shears regularly to keep them dense and prevent having to cut them back hard. The clippings can go on the compost heap.

Trees, shrubs and climbers planted last autumn or earlier this spring will not have properly established roots yet, so keep them well watered during dry or gusty weather.

Unless you're in colder areas of the country, remove all bubble wrap and other protection wrapped around pots and containers to protect plant roots from frosts. If there are frosts still to come, they are unlikely to be too harsh.

School's Out!

Schools in the UK have now officially been shut since Friday 20th March, and many parents have found themselves having to take on the role of teacher as well as parent as they attempt to home-school their children.

Some parents are feeling overwhelmed, and MyTutor – the UK's leading online tutoring service – want to help reassure parents and help alleviate some of the pressure being felt. Remember: it is impossible to be a full-time teacher, especially for working parents. Kids aren't learning for every second of the school day either, so the most helpful thing for parents to do at this time is help structure the day for children. Here are MyTutor's top tips for doing just that:

I. Set good habits around phone use and have honest conversations

Teens spend a lot of time on apps speaking with their friends anyway - and isolation will only increase their desire to communicate socially. While some communication will be positive for their mental health, the opposite is true when social media fuels feelings of isolation and anxiety. You'll need to set some ground rules for how phones are used during the day and make sure to have honest conversations with them about their mood.

2. Organise your days (and make sure to go outside!)

Without the structure of a work or school day, and without the engagement of peers, motivation and energy can take a dive. Create a timetable that'll work for both you and your child, covering their subjects and your own workload. Divide up periods of work and study

Self-study is an incredibly hard skill to master and secondary school pupils may struggle without someone actively explaining concepts to them. Basic Bread Dough – no knead method

This is my no-knead method, it's super easy, but don't try and knead it it's too wet a mixture, also don't use a mixer, it will just stick to the dough hook. Make sure your measurements are exact for the flour and water.

Ingredients: for | loaf

500g strong flour 1.5 tsp salt 10g fresh yeast or 1 sachet dried yeast 350ml water – room temperature or luke warm 1 tbsp extra virgin olive oil

How to make bread......WASH YOUR HANDS

I. Place the flour and salt in a bowl and mix well. Crumble the fresh yeast into a bowl with the warm water, if using dried yeast just sprinkle this over the water, mix until the yeast has dissolved. Tip the dry ingredients into wet ingredients and mix with a dough scraper or wooden spoon. Pour the olive oil into the clean bowl and transfer the dough to this bowl. Cover with a damp tea towel or oiled ding film and set the timer for 10 minutes.

2. After 10 minutes remove the cover and pull the outside of the dough across to the other side, turning the bowl so you make around 8-12 'pulls', the dough will start to resist a little. Cover, set the timer for 10 minutes, repeat 3 more times.

3. After the final 'knead' the dough should be lovely and smooth, now it needs to develop flavour. Allow the dough to rest for 1 hour – no more, no less, 1 hour, covered with a damp tea towel in a warm place. The microwave will do, don't use the top of the AGA or the airing cupboards, one is too hot the other is too dry, next to the AGA is fine, make sure the tea towel doesn't dry out.



4. After the hour the dough should be around double it's size, you need to keep this precious air inside the dough so don't do as you may have been taught in school and 'knock back' the dough, but gently lift it out of the bowl onto a lightly floured (yes I know, this time I'm allowing you to add a little four) surface and gently fold the outside edges of the dough into the middle, moulding it into the shape you would like it to be - left as a round 'cob' or transferring it to a greased loaf tin.

5. Once it's been moulded then it needs proving to develop the flavour, cover the dough with a damp tea towel and leave it for 45 mins until it's just under double it's size, don't let it get any bigger.

6. Meanwhile preheat the oven to 220oc/gas 8 and put a flat baking tray on the bottom of the oven.

7. Bake your bread, either as a loaf for around 30-40 minutes or remove the hot baking tray from the oven and gently transfer the loaf onto it, bake for 40-45 mins, until dark golden brown and when you tap underneath it sounds 'hollow'.

Impacts of excessive Technologyuse

More than ever, we are becoming increasingly dependent on computers and mobile phones towork, communicate, and gather information.

Having a surplus of information at our fingertips is pretty impressive. However, the long hours of using our fingers to be constantly connected can be detrimental to our hands and wrists.

There are a number of health issues associated with such overuse.

Causes of hand and wrist pain include:

 Tendinitis – presenting as pain and swelling, tendinopathies are due to inflammation of the tendon sheaths that surround the tendons.

Covid-19: National pet charity Blue Cross issues essential advice for pet owners

With lockdown now in place, pet owners across the UK are either social distancing or self isolating. Blue Cross is looking at the impact this will have on the nations's pets and their owners during this unsettling time and is offering essential advice and answering the many questions on pet owners minds.

Those social distancing can still take their dog for a walk and exercise once a day but they MUST

keep their distance from other people by at least two metres. However, if self isolating because they, or a member of their household, has had signs of the disease they should not go out at all. Someone from outside of the household may have to take their dog out for them. Owners can ask friends, neighbours or family members if they can help and there are also increasingly numbers of community groups offering to walk dogs and pick up essential pet supplies. Affected owners



can check local media and social media to find someone in their area. Volunteer dog walkers should use their own dog lead or disinfect the owner's lead.

It is important pet owners wash their hands after handling their pets, and if unwell and self isolating it is also a good idea to avoid other people stroking and handling their pets.

If pets aren't getting their usual amount of exercise it is important owners make up for this to keep pets healthy and mentally stimulated. The charity has some tips for pet owners while they are spending more time at home:

• Encourage pets to play with toys and treats by hiding them around the home or playing fetch (make sure toys are soft to avoid damaging any household items) and even play hide and seek with pets and other family members – especially fun for children at home while schools are closed too. Don't forget if playing with pets using treats you may need to reduce the amount they have for their daily meal.

• Your dog might also enjoy might enjoy a game of tug with a favourite toy, make sure these are controlled games and your pet understands that when you put their tuggy toy down it is time to stop. Pets can also be kept busy by having their food via a kong or activity toy.

• Cats will benefit from having scratch posts, climbing apparatus and chase toys and many also enjoy playing with toys such as feather wands and balls. While at home, all the family can take some time out to have a few minutes of regular playtime with their cat – fun for both cats and their owners.

• Hide biscuits or food parcels in a cardboard box filled with shredded paper or a cleaned out yoghurt drink pot for pets to bat about to release the food.

• Being at home could also be a time to continue pet training – even cats can be trained using a clicker device where they understand a reward is

coming for an act they are doing when asked by their owner.

• If pets are becoming a distraction while trying to work from home and to avoid them becoming too clingy (potentially leading to dogs suffering from separation anxiety when their owners go back to work) it is a good idea to pop them in another room to rest for periods during the day. Owners may also benefit from putting pets in another room if using skype or phone meetings to avoid pets being a distraction.

• Cats who usually spend the day outdoors exploring may prefer to stay in with their owners instead. Owners can encourage their cat to go outside by going into the garden themselves and let them follow and see if they will jump onto fences or into trees to keep them active.

Pet owners regularly using hand sanitiser should remember that many cleaning products are toxic to pets and it is best to avoid stroking and handling your pets straight after using sanitisers. When cleaning, remember that pets should be kept away from areas being disinfected until completely dry and prevent pets going near cleaning buckets and cleaning products. Cats in particular will lick their paws and fur almost immediately if they feel unclean and such products can potentially burn their mouth, tongue or throat.

Find out the situation with your vet practice and where emergency treatment is being offered. Some vet practices are offering routine and nonurgent consultations remotely and any medication needed prescriptions via email to order online.
